The Housing Choice Voucher program, funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) subsidizes the rents of qualified very low-income tenants to affordable levels.

Type of Assistance: Through the Housing Choice Voucher Program, the Housing Authority issues a voucher to an income-qualified household. The household is responsible for finding a unit to rent. The unit must meet Housing Quality Standards.

Under the Housing Voucher Program, the rent may exceed the FMR but must be reasonable compared with similar unassisted units. The Housing Authority pays the landlord the amount equal to the difference between the Housing Authority determined payment standard (about 80 to 110% of the FMR) and 30% of the tenant's adjusted income. The tenant may choose a unit with a higher rent than the FMR. However, the tenant's portion cannot exceed 40% of the adjusted income.

Eligible Households:

In general, to be eligible, a household's income may not exceed 50% of the area median income adjusted for household size. HUD determines median income levels for each year annually.
