

Robert Murray Anderson (19.. – 1943)

Robert M. Anderson served in the United States Army Air Corps and attended the University of Washington.

His wife resided at the home of Dr. Roberts on Sierra Way in the Country Club District of Chula Vista at the time of his death at 11:00pm on Friday night, August 31, 1943. His parents are Mr. and Mrs. John M. Anderson of San Ysidro, CA.

"Murray", as he was known to his many friends here was employed by the Borg Furniture company for about two years previous to his entry into the Army Air Corps. He was a popular young man, always courteous and his sunny disposition won him a host of friends.

He was a graduate of Sweetwater Union High School. He was married to Miss Margarie Moie on July 14, 1941. He is survived by his bereaved wife, his parents, a sister, Mrs. Emlyn Owen, and his grandmother, Mrs. Sarah Anderson.

He was killed in a bomber crash at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He was killed in the line of duty and was awarded the Purple Heart. (Source: The *Star-News* dated Sept 3, 1943, Page 1).
