

Robert Howard Ingram (1944 – 1968)

Robert Ingram was born in Chula Vista CA on 21 September 1944. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Ingram of 1008 Gutay, Chula Vista. He is also survived by his brother, Army Spec 5 Dennis F. Ingram. He had just spent time together with his brother the week before at Soc Trang, South Vietnam. He was a graduate of Hilltop High School, and joined the army in 1962. In high school, Robert Ingram was a member of the Cadet corps. Another brother, Airman 1C Frank T. Ingram (USAF) is assigned to Misawa Japan.

He enlisted in the U.S. Army two and attained the rank of SP4 (E4). He died on 21 December 1968 at Quang Nam, South Vietnam. SP4 Ingram had committed suicide. His body was recovered. He had served for three years in Germany before his assignment to South Vietnam. He was assigned to the Signal Corps Battalion, and had planned to make the army his career. A street in Chula Vista was named in his honor.

His remains were forwarded to the Humphrey Mortuary where arrangements will be made for a funeral. His name appears on the WALL in Washington D.C and is located at Panel 36 West, Row 057. His name appears at the San Diego Peace Memorial in Balboa Park, as well as at Memorial Park in Chula Vista.
